


BENEDICTION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT






¶ The Priest alone stands and sings

¶ Ascending the Altar steps, the Priest raises the Monstrance containing the Blessed Sacrament, and solemnly blesses the People with the sign of the Cross.

 \P A period of silence is kept.

¶ The Divine Praises are repeated after the Priest.

Blessed be his Holy Name.

Blessed be Jesus Christ, true God, and true Man.

Blessed be the name of Jesus.

Blessed be his most sacred Heart.

Blessed be Jesus in the most holy Sacrament of the Altar.

Blessed be the name of Mary, Virgin and Mother.

Blessed be St Joseph, her most chaste Spouse.
